WGRC, the Greece FM radio station, is scheduled to go on the air on September 1st, 1972, and students will be needed to staff and help run the station. Sign-ups will take place at Athena High School on March 8th and 9th, and all Juniors, Sophomores and Freshmen are encouraged to join.

All types of jobs will be opening in this new venture, which will be providing pertinent and stimulating radio programming to serve our community. Such jobs as Announcing, Public Relations, Business Management, Production, Engineering, Promotion, News, and Sports, among others, will need to be filled, and everyone interested in these fields is welcome to become part of this station.

A number of activities will take place following sign-ups. A fund drive throughout Greece is planned, and station planning and production will begin almost immediately. It was made known recently that Greece Athena High School will not enter the Mathematical Association of America's annual High School Math Contest, as it has in past years.

It appears that the application, which was filed by the Math dept. on time for the deadline, was lost while awaiting the signature of Athena's principal. Due to a breakdown of communications somewhere, no one knew that this had happened, and therefore, no application was sent in to the M.A.A.

The contest is sponsored annually by the M.A.A., the Society of Actuaries, Mu Alpha Theta, and the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics. The contest examination was scheduled to be given on the morning of March 7th.

Although the exam can be administered to the approximately 25 students who were signed up to take it, the scores registered by them can not be used in the national competition.
